



## **South Memphis Neighborhood Connector**

### **Overview**

The person fulfilling this job conducts community organizing so that residential and organizational stakeholders identify, plan for, and implement activities that enhance South Memphis as a great place to live. The organizing work is done on behalf of the South Memphis Shalom Zone (SMSZ) with a direct reporting relationship to the Center for Transforming Communities (CTC).

### **Essential Duties and Responsibilities**

Mobilize neighbors and stakeholders around shared interests/concerns

- Have conversations with neighbors (Door-to-door, special events, etc.)
- Identify individuals who can lead as block-level connectors, project leaders, etc.

Equip and accompany leaders (including SMSZ Shalom Team members) to:

- Facilitate neighborhood walks and debriefing sessions involving interested neighbors/citizens
- Host neighbor conversations
- Conduct interviews with organizational stakeholders
- Interpret the feedback and identify patterns of shared interests, concerns, and hopes among all neighborhood stakeholders
- Link neighbors and stakeholders (local and regional) together around shared interests/etc.
- Mobilize neighbors to implement projects that the above activities inspire

Meet monthly with SMSZ Team

- Coordinate and communicate the meetings
- Facilitate and support Shalom Team's decisions and activities
- Provide updates of monthly Connector activities
- Equip and support the Shalom Teams in the larger mobilization of the neighborhood in the achievement of common goals

Maintain data and documentation that is available to all stakeholders:

- Keep a journal of neighborhood walks that includes areas covered, time involved, and key observations regarding people and the overall environment (i.e. architecture, houses, spaces/boundaries, businesses, gathering places, etc.)
- Maintain database of contact information of neighbors and stakeholders, including information about interest areas, gifts and assets, and other information gathered via listening sessions and interviews
- Use mapping tools to develop block level information and gift/asset inventories
- Keep accurate and complete monitoring data (#'s at meetings, etc.)
- Complete monthly reports

Champion and teach the practices and principles of Communities of Shalom

- Consistently communicate the basic principles/practices of Asset Based Community Development (ABCD) in all settings
- Involve others in the communication of ABCD (based on modeling/teaching)
- Provide basic ABCD training for interested individuals/organizations

Participate in training and/or personal skill development

- Participate in weekly Connector Cohort meetings
- Facilitate sharing and collaboration across Shalom Zones
- Share knowledge and skills with Shalom Teams and neighborhood leaders

### **Minimum Requirements**

1. At least 18 years of age at the commencement of service
2. Has a high school diploma or an equivalency certificate
3. Lives in South Memphis or can demonstrate a deep connection to the neighborhood (such as active volunteer or member of a church in the neighborhood)

### **Desired Qualities and Skills**

1. Demonstrated interest in and compassion for community building/community development
2. Motivated by the desire to make a difference in the lives of others and a vision of them living at their full potential
3. Compassionate and respectful of people of diverse backgrounds and perspectives (cultural, social, economic, and religious)
4. Good interpersonal and communication skills: able to express ideas clearly, listen with sensitivity, and build trusting relationships
5. Demonstrated emotional maturity: able to work under difficult and changing conditions
6. Resilient and capable of remaining steadfast and patient in times of emotional stress and resident frustration.
7. Resourceful and adaptable: able to seek out (research) needed resources and use different approaches/methods, with a willingness to learn
8. Analytical, problem-solving skills
9. Demonstrated proficiency in basic technologies
10. Ability to give, accept, and respond to criticism in a constructive manner.

### **Necessary Experience(s)**

1. Volunteer or work experience with a community-oriented organization is required.
2. Small or large group leadership or process facilitation experience is required. (Examples of leadership might include student council, bible study group, ESL class, or a Scout Troup.)
3. Previous participation in community development learning/training is preferred.

### **Physical Demands**

Necessary physical skills are directly related to duties and responsibilities described above. Reasonable accommodations will be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

### **Reporting**

The Neighborhood Connector will report to the Executive Director of Center for Transforming Communities.

### **Work Conditions**

- The job requires some evening and weekends in order to attend neighborhood meetings, events or to meet project deadlines.
- Use of personal vehicle will be required for the purpose of off-site/neighborhood meetings with stakeholders or partner agencies.

### **Shalom Zone Boundaries**

The South Memphis Shalom Zone is loosely bounded by:  
Third (west); Crump (north); Mississippi (east); McLemore (south)

### **Compensation**

Salary is \$30,000 per year. This is a full time position.
